My name is Linea' Givens, MTC shop steward for AFSCME local 1427. First and foremost I just want to say I'm so thankful and blessed to have met and be amongst strong leaders who taught and continue to teach me the skills, knowledge and values that will help shape my career and future. With that being said I've worked alongside Executive president, Dorian Johnson, Vice president, Brittany Cozart, Institutional Vice president, Chantel Simmons, Chief Steward, Naomi Lacy and local 1427 shop stewards. Collectively labor requested to secure additional cadre training for entry-level officers, with the focus to show under the guidance of seasoned professional. We have been advocating for this initiative for over a year due to recent events such as the Idaho manhunt and inmate escape. This 1 week training course training was backed by Warden Kathleen Landerkin. I had the pleasure of becoming the first Cadre officer to go through the training at the Baltimore City Booking Intake Center, working in the Medical Transportation Unit. The supervisor and officers within this unit was open to teaching me the duties and safety measures that is demanded to perform the duties as a cadre officer in a safe manner. They were very welcoming and they all displayed positive attitudes. They have all increased my knowledge and awareness as they exemplified showing me the proper techniques of how to secure a three piece, conduct a female strip search, safely transport incarcerated individuals, including the Do's and Don't's while out on the road, reviewing documents/ paperwork and ID's before transporting,documenting in the transport book as well as the log book (when a log book is available) and things to look out for while on duty with my service weapon. This would not have happened if it wasn't for our labor who continuously fight endlessly for critical and imperative changes to ensure the safety and effectiveness of our officers. Again I would like to thank administration for working collaboratively with labor on implementing this training

Our Goal


