

PURCHASES, HIGHWAY COMMISSION, INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION,
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION, DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
AND MARKETS, INSURANCE DEPARTMENT, AND THE DEPARTMENT
OF STATE. OTHER DEPARTMENTS ARE BEING ORGANIZED AND
