Union Plus Disaster Relief Grants of \$500 are available to help eligible participants in the AFSCME Advantage/ Union Plus Credit Card, Insurance or Mortgage programs who are facing financial hardship due to the disaster. FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION (FEMA)

FEMA is leading the federal government's effort to provide assistance and support to Texas residents affected by Hurricane Harvey. SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (SBA)

After a disaster, the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) provides loans to affected homeowners (whether they own a small business or not). These are low-interest loans that can be used to repair or replace real estate, personal property, machinery and equipment, and inventory and business assets.
