In 2023, our union showed up to get our contracts funded, protect the services we provide, and advocate for the public employees who make Washington happen.

Thanks to member advocacy, we expanded collective bargaining rights for WMS employees, protected public employee victims of domestic violence and stalking, improved child welfare policy, and more.

PRIORIT

We expanded collective bargaining rights for

public employees. HB 1122: Allows WMS employees in salary band 1 and 2 the ability to collectively bargain and join a union.

We fought trades outsourcing in higher education and protected our members' work. SB 5385: Increases higher education bid limits,

protecting public employee work from outsourcing.

We protected confidentiality between a represented employee and their union.

HB 1187: Ensures communication between an employee and the union who represents them is not subject to subpoena.

We protected public employee victims of domestic violence and stalking.

HB 1533: Makes it easier for public employee victims of domestic violence and stalking to have their personal information redacted from public records requests.

We stood up for language access equity and professional standards for interpreters.

SB 5304: Protects the testing and certification standards of spoken language interpreters.

We brought back rewards for public employees who make innovative improvements.

SB 5015: Reestablishes the state Productivity Board and rewards the ingenuity of state employees.


