Members: Why Voting Pro-Worker Matters

Member organizer Denna Thurmond of Local 2829:

"We hear you, we see you, we want you to get out and vote! What's on the line is actually American values, what we stand for as a country, what we stand for as workers. At the end of your career, you should have something to fall back on such as your benefit package, your pension, affordable health care, other things that are important to American people, working class people. I want to keep my rights in the workplace."

Local 66 member, social worker Theresa O'Halloran Johnson:

"It's so very important people get out and vote. I really believe in our democracy. The fight against public unions doesn't just hurt public unions and people in them like me, but it hurts the people we support and the people we serve. I know that Tim Walz, Peggy Flanagan and Joe Radinovich are going to actually help protect those rights, and we need them in office."

Local 600 president, correctional officer John C. Hillyard:

"Tim Walz has a lot of the values we share as a union and as individuals. For correctional officers especially, Tim is really behind us 100 percent. He knows what we need. He engages with us and talks to us and will make sure we get the help we need. He's a very good union guy. He's a good person, human being, and he goes the right direction on all things."

Member organizer Starr Suggs of Local 3142:

"I just want fairness," Suggs says. When she goes into the workplace, she wants to be judged by how hard she works, not the color of her skin. "I want great wages because I have to take care of my family. I want great dental, medical, I want great retirement benefits. Looking at all the DFL candidates, they support my views on what I think is important, being a Minnesotan."

Council 5 president Patrick Guernsey:

"A lot of people are concerned about their health care, about losing their healthcare. That's why we're supporting Tim Walz. He wants to sponsor a buy-in to MinnesotaCare. People want to see improvements in our transportation system. We have a lot of construction going on right now thanks to Gov. Dayton, and we need to keep doing that to improve our infrastructure, and we need good transit so people can get to work."

Local 599 president, CO Rick Neyssen:

"It's super vital we get out to vote. It's our future, both labor people and just Minnesotans in general. It's the single biggest, most important thing you can do as a citizen, in my mind."
