

The Nevada State AFL-CIO has announced its annual scholarship program for Nevada students. The **JONES EVANS** ARNOLD 2016 SCHOLARSHIP FUND offers \$3,000 scholarships to students college from entering households.

2016 ESSAY QUESTION:

ARNOLD/JONES/EVANS



During the last Legislative Session in 2015, Republicans controlled the State Senate, State Assembly, and the Governor's office. In the end, Tea Party Republicans did not accomplish their goal because Democrats were able to leverage a compromise on new taxes that Governor Sandoval wanted to fund education. However, because there is nothing similar for Democrats to leverage in the next session, that type of compromise to protect working people's rights will not happen again in the 2017 Legislature.

What are the steps that labor unions should take to prevent these legislative attacks on Nevada's working people from happening again?

The purpose of this essay contest is to award three (3) \$3,000.00 scholarships for attending an accredited public or private University, Community College, Vocational or Technical School **anywhere** in the United States.

The three (3) \$3,000 scholarships will be awarded to three students.

Requirements and Eligibility Criteria:

Applicants must be a natural or legally adopted child of an active or retired member in good standing of any local union affiliated with the Nevada State AFL-CIO.

Applicants must be graduating high school seniors when making application.

Applicants must currently have a 2.0 grade point average and have maintained such for their last full year of school prior to application.

Financial need is NOT a criterion for this scholarship.

Applications may be downloaded from the NV State AFL-CIO web site or picked up at any Nevada State AFL-CIO affiliated local union.

A copy of the grade transcript to support claim of 2.0 grade point average and a statement of career goals or intent must accompany the application.

All applications must be accompanied by a written essay, **1,000 words minimum**, on the subject designated by the Nevada State AFL-CIO Executive Board.

Essays should be submitted on 8 ½" by 11" paper, on one side, preferably typed and double spaced, with applicants' written signature, printed name and email address at the conclusion of the essay.

AFL-CIO Scholarship Program, cont.

Applications must be mailed and postmarked by August 1, 2016 to:

The Scholarship Committee will review all applications to assure that all eligibility criteria and requirements have been followed and met.

Essays will be reviewed by a selected committee and scored by at least three readers.

Failure on the part of the applicant to meet the rules may subject the applicant to disqualification by the Committee. If disqualified, the decision of the Scholarship Committee will be final.

Scholarships will be awarded after acceptance to school of applicant's choice.

An appropriate notification will be presented to the winners by an Officer of the Nevada State AFL-CIO prior to **August 15, 2016**.

The Scholarship will be awarded at the Nevada State AFL-CIO Annual Convention, <u>August 24, 2016</u>, in Reno, Nevada.
